

Andreas J. Bäuml

Biographical Sketch

Andreas Bäuml is currently Professor and Vice Chair of Research in the Department of Medical Microbiology and Immunology at the University of California Davis School of Medicine.

Dr. Bäuml is a native of the state of Bavaria in Germany. He studied biology at the Friedrich-Alexander University Erlangen from 1982-1985 and at the Eberhardt-Karls University Tübingen from 1985-1989. For his thesis, he worked on iron acquisition of the enteric pathogen *Yersinia enterocolitica* in the laboratory of Prof. Dr. Volkmar Braun and Prof. Dr. Klaus Hantke at the Eberhardt-Karls University Tübingen, where he received his PhD (Doktor der Naturwissenschaften) in 1992. During his time as a postdoctoral fellow in the laboratory of Dr. Fred Heffron at the Oregon Health Sciences University in Portland, Oregon, from 1992-1995, he started his work on *Salmonella* pathogenesis. He was promoted to Research Assistant Professor at the Oregon Health Sciences University in 1995, before accepting a position as an Assistant Professor of Medical Microbiology and Immunology at the Texas A&M University Health Science Center in College Station, Texas, in 1996. From 2001 to 2005 he was an Associate Professor with tenure at the Texas A&M University Health Science Center. In 2005, he accepted a position as Professor of Medical Microbiology and Immunology at the University of California Davis where he began studying the interplay between enteric pathogens, their host and its microbiota. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Microbiology (2010) and the German National Academy of Sciences Leopoldina (2020).
